Information about the proposed 2019–2020 budget and election will be available at a Public Information Meeting to be held at the Library on **Thursday, March 21, 2019** at 7pm. Voter registration will be available in the library from 10am–8pm on **Wednesday, March 27, 2019**.

Applications and information for casting absentee ballots will be available beginning **March 11, 2019**. All completed absentee ballots must be returned to the Library by 5pm on **April 2, 2019**. Applications are due no later than **April 1, 2019**.

Petition forms and information for the office of Library Trustee are now available at the Library. Petitions are due at the Library by 5pm on **March 4, 2019**.
