Information about the proposed 2020–2021 budget and election will be available at a Public Information Meeting to be held at the Library on **Thursday, March 26, 2020** at 7pm. Voter registration will be available in the library from 2pm–8pm on **Wednesday, April 1, 2020**.

Applications and information for casting absentee ballots will be available beginning **March 9, 2020**. All completed absentee ballots must be returned to the Library by 5pm on **April 7, 2020**. Applications are due no later than **April 6, 2020**.

Petition forms and information for the office of Library Trustee are now available at the Library. Petitions are due at the Library by 5pm on **March 6, 2020**.
